The BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS met with Larry Higginbotham, Road Supervisor, for the weekly road update. Also present at the meeting was John Robinson, County Attorney.

Larry has received a letter from the State Highway Department about guard rails on the Eastside Highway that need fixing. The letter was in regard to guard rail ends and terminal ends on crossover roads. Larry said the County does not have the necessary equipment to make the holes to install the ends. Larry is going to write to the State to see if they will loan Ravalli County the needed augur.

Commissioner Tossberg said that in one letter the State did indicate that they would help with materials.

Larry said that Larry Creek should be finished by Wednesday. Then the Road Department will move on to Victor Main Street, Sleeping Child Rd., and Colpits Rd.

Larry has been in touch with Del Crawford to determine what the Search and Rescue wants in the way of signing for their driveway.

Mr. Tucker from Pleasant View Rd. contacted the Board. Larry installed a "curve" sign on Pleasant View Rd. After inspecting the area, Larry said it was obvious what the problem was.

John Robinson talked to the attorney that represents Gary Preston. John said that if Larry will mark where he wants to put the road, there should not be a problem. Mr. Preston wants to cooperate. Chairman Davis asked about Mr. Leonard Leece. John said that Mr. Leece has indicated that he will also cooperate.

Larry has been unable to contact Sharon Prinzing from Montana Rail Link about the Railroad Crossings. Larry feels it is MRL's responsibility to put up signing. 69-14-621 & 622 gives the Commissioners the authority to order a hearing.

Larry checked on the Airport for fencing for the Forest Service Heliport.

Larry has determined the problem with the Victor Main Street. East of the mud hole is another store. The owners made some improvements and poured a concrete apron making the ground higher than the rest of the road. That is what is creating the ponding effect.

Larry has received a letter from Ray Barnicoat about the Risk Management Program meeting. Chairman Davis said he may want to contact the Commissioner-elect about attending the meeting with him. It is a very informative meeting.

Larry said the Board may want to begin thinking about a new Safety Director.

At 2 PM the BOARD had a public Bid Opening for County printing services and legal publications. Only one bid was received for legal publications, that was from Ravalli Republic.

Two bids were received for County printing. One was from Sapphire Printing which proposed prices from Franklin Catalog less 12%. The other was from Professional Impressions which proposed prices from Franklin Catalog less 10%. The BOARD took the bids under advisement.

Don Mullin, Sanitarian met with the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS to recommend approval of the following Certificate of Survey:


