Jay Unrue, County Road Supervisor, met with the Commissioners for his weekly road update. Last night's heavy rain was discussed and Jay said his crew is out grading and cleaning up the trees that were knocked down with the strong winds. Commissioner Allen said that Mrs. Buckmire had called asking when the trees would be trimmed around her house. Jay said that they will be getting to this. Commissioner Allen said that they had received a call from Bob Brown that there was a near accident on the North Burnt Fork Road. He asked Jay if he could ask the guy who lives up there if they could trim up some of the trees on his property. Jay said that the only hazard that he sees is that they don't yield on the signs coming into the Burnt Fork road. He said that there may be a little trimming needed, and his men are working that way. He said that maybe the signs need to be changed from "Yield" to "Stop". He said he would check into this.

Chairman Tossberg said that when you leave Highway 93 going up to Lake Como, on the first curve, right by Kyles, the sign is down. Jay said he would have Wayne check this out.

The Commissioners asked Jay if he had seen the petition from the people up on Bowman Road. Jay said he had. Commissioner Allen asked Jay to do a traffic count up there. There was more discussion on where traffic counts had been taken and what roads had the most traffic.

Commissioner Davis asked Jay to check out the "Ravalli County" sign on the County line as it is leaning wrong and must have been hit when the Road Dept. cleaned the ditch down there.

Commissioner Allen said he had noticed that the Road Dept. had finished up down in Corvallis.
