Shall the Ravalli County Park District No. 2, Ravalli County, Montana, also known as Bitterroot Aquatic Center (the "District"), be authorized to sell and issue general obligation park district bonds in the aggregate principal amount of up to Five Million Eight Hundred Forty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$5,840,000), bearing interest at rates to be determined at the time of the sale... <p>BALLOT ISSUE</p> <p>RAVALLI COUNTY PARK DISTRICT NO. 2, RAVALLI COUNTY, MONTANA BITTERROOT AQUATIC CENTER</p> <p>PARK DISTRICT BOND ELECTION NOVEMBER 5, 2019</p> <p>INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS: Completely fill in the oval using a blue or black ink pen before the words "BONDS—YES" if you wish to vote for the bond issue; if you are opposed to the bond issue, completely fill in the oval using a blue or black ink pen before the words "BONDS—NO."</p> <p>Shall Ravalli County Park District No. 2, Ravalli County, Montana, also known as Bitterroot Aquatic Center (the "District"), be authorized to sell and issue general obligation park district bonds in the aggregate principal amount of up to Five Million Eight Hundred Forty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$5,840,000), bearing interest at rates to be determined at the time of the sale, payable semiannually, during a term of not more than twenty (20) years, for the purpose of paying the costs of designing, constructing, equipping, and furnishing improvements to the Bitterroot Aquatic Center, including enclosing the existing outdoor lap pool and splash pad; remodeling and enlarging locker room and bathrooms; constructing an addition to include a family bathroom, entry space and office space; updating pump room equipment; making site improvements; related amenities and improvements (the "Project"), and paying costs associated with the sale and issuance of the bonds?</p> <p>Assuming a 20-year term and an annual interest rate of 4.50%, it is estimated that, as of the date hereof, the mill levy to repay the bonds would add approximately \$15.98 annually in property taxes to a home in the District valued at \$100,000 and approximately \$31.96 annually in property taxes to a home in the District valued at \$200,000.</p> <p>The election on the mill levy for operation and maintenance of the Project held simultaneously with this bond election must be approved by the voters for the bond issue to proceed.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> BONDS - YES <input type="radio"/> BONDS - NO</p>	<p>Shall Ravalli County Park District No. 2, Ravalli County, Montana, also known as Bitterroot Aquatic Center (the "District"), be authorized to levy permanently 9.3 mills per year, currently producing approximately \$350,000 annually, in addition to the existing mill levy of the District, to be used by the District to provide funds for the operation and maintenance of the Bitterroot Aquatic Center?</p> <p>It is estimated that a levy of 9.3 mills would, as of the date hereof, add approximately \$12.56 annually in property taxes to a home in the District valued at \$100,000 and approximately \$25.11 annually in property taxes to a home in the District valued at \$200,000.</p> <p>The election on the issuance of general obligation park district bonds to pay for the aquatic facility held simultaneously with this mill levy election must be approved by the voters for the proposed mill levy to go into effect.
