Spinners Challenge Fiber for 2020

SEACELL

Spinners Challenge consists of fiber spun from Seacell and displayed as a finished item (not just spun fiber). Fiber content used must be stated on a hanging tag on the exhibit. All entries must be shown and judged in a regular class in the Natural Fiber department.

***Please notify the Superintendent on entry day that item is a "Spinners Challenge".**

Selection of winner will be made with strong consideration given to creativity, quality of spinning, suitability of yarn to the final project and overall quality of the work. Use of Seacell must be at least 50%.

Scorecard for Judging Spinners Challenge

Creativity:

Originality of design & technique;

Use of color & texture40%

Spinning Quality:

Consistency of twist.....10%

Size of yarn appropriate to fiber used & finished product20%

Finished project demonstrates appropriate use of spun yarn20%

Finishing:

Blocking, fulling, seaming and embellishment appropriate for finished item.....10%

Total.....100%

Please Read Open Class General Rules and Regulations located at the front of the Fair book.

RULES AND REGULATIONS – NEW for 2020!

1. **8"x10" or 8"x12" photos only**
2. Photo must be securely taped to mat. **11"x14", Mat Frame Required**
3. Mat, 11"x14" outside dimension. Wood, metal, glass, shrink wrap, etc. frames will **NOT** be accepted.
4. Mats will be available at the fair office for purchase. (while supplies last) \$2 for 8x10 \$3 for 8x12 black mat (you must mount photos on your own)
5. Mounting board or backer is **NOT** required.
6. Tag placement: tape string on back so they hang over the **UPPER LEFT corner** on the front.
7. Detach and retain your "Claim tag" stub from the bottom of your tag. Required to pick up your photo after the fair.
8. Clearly print your name and phone number on back of each photo.
9. **Maximum 6 entries per person total.**
10. **Maximum 1 entry per lot per person.**
11. Lot 10, Group of Photos: Photos must be 4x6 or 5x7. Mounting board/backer is required no larger than 16"x20".
12. **Photographs are judged on: A) clean print, no printer lines, dirt or date. B) focus C) clarity D) impact E) difficulty F) presentation G) followed rules H) correct White Balance.**
13. Age classes: Adult 18 and older; Junior: 12-17 years; Children: 5-11 years.

Here are a few simple tips:

- Use a tripod for a sharp photo
- Use the rule of thirds
- Ask, "Why am I taking this shot?" Will others like it?
- Look at similar photos online that are popular
