Public Health Update

June 5, 2020... As of 5 p.m., today there have been no new COVID-19 cases in Ravalli County.

There is one active case due to come out of isolation tomorrow, Saturday June 6th. There are currently no hospitalized cases in Ravalli County. Close contacts to the positive case remain in self-quarantine, monitoring for symptoms until next week.

Ravalli County residents are encouraged to practice physical distancing. CDC recommends frequent hand washing and sanitizing when hand washing is unavailable. You can protect your neighbor by wearing a cloth face mask while in public places where physical distancing is difficult to maintain.

Ravalli County Public Health would like to thank all of its residents for doing their part to help slow the spread of this virus. Want to help?

If you have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19, a Public Health Nurse will call you and inform you of the exposure. The nurse will conduct an interview to determine your exposure risk. Based on that information you may be asked to stay home and self-quarantine for 14 days, while monitoring for symptoms.
