

# Tired Iron Antique Tractor Club

In the 1990's a group of tractor and small engine collectors began meeting in Missoula and called themselves the "Antique Power Association". They also went to Teller Wildlife Refuge and put on threshing demonstrations. Local farmers and collectors would bring tractor and horse-drawn implements to Teller Refuge and demonstrate plowing in the spring and then would cut enough oats with a power binder to have bundles to thresh at the end of summer. This led to having displays and threshing demonstrations of old tractors at the Ravalli County Fair. Mel Whiting of Stevensville helped start the local club in Ravalli County. The meetings are informal, usually in someone's shop fixing tractors. Discussions are had about getting ready for Fair and figuring out what rusty tool dug up in someone's yard will be on display for the current year. Collectors display tractors in the Fair Parade and then on the grounds the entire week of Fair. Some members recall the days before electricity and most power being from horses. Some complained about the work of threshing as kids and now cheerfully do the same work for an audience at the Ravalli County Fair. Threshing demonstrations start at 2pm Thursday, Friday and Saturday in the North Lawn Area with Straw Baling directly after; come by and chat with these amazing historians, you will be glad you did!
