

- 9. Horned animals and wethers can be exhibited in Angora, Pygora, Pygmy and Boer only. No horns allowed in Dairy classes.
- 10. Exhibitor must be present to show their own animal unless excused by the Superintendent.
- 11. All goats may be removed from the building 7:00 am - 12:00 pm Sunday. Enter through the North Gate only.
- 12. Exhibitors must wear all white (dairy) or white shirts and dark pants or official dress for FFA. Shirts must have long sleeves. (Refer to the general rules for dress code).

- 16. Market goat weight range is from 70 lbs. to 120 lbs. Goats over 120 lbs. can be sold at the Livestock Auction but the owner will be paid for no more than 120lbs. Goats weighing in under 70 lbs. can be shown in the senior kids, 8-12 months' lot, but will not be sold at the Livestock Auction.
- 17. Scrapie tags must be in the market goats' ears before the goat enters the fairgrounds.
- 18. The Exhibitor is responsible for cleaning pens. A pen fee of \$20 per pen will be charged for any uncleaned pen.
- 19. Wethers or bucks cannot be shown in the dairy show.

20. All 4-H and FFA male market goats must be altered or banded by the day of spring weigh in. Goats will be checked during the spring weighin to make sure that this has been done and be free of infection from the alteration at Fair time. If a crytorchid is found during weigh-in, a follow up inspection of those animals will take place by July 1st.
